WHO ARE WE LOOKING FOR?

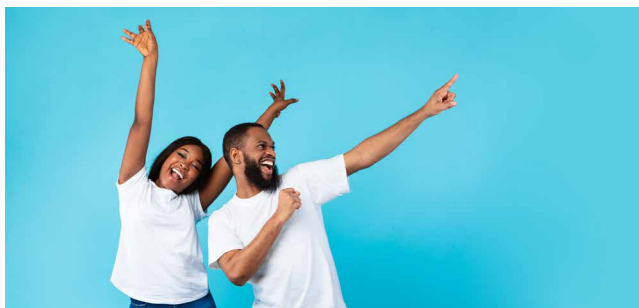
We want you to be successful abroad. For this purpose all Bluekazi candidates need to meet the following requirements:

- 1. Age range:** 23 up to 45.
- 2. Agile personality:** Eagerness to grow from a long term abroad experience, new work methods and different processes.
- 3. Language skills:** Committed to learn basic German Language skills and pass the B1 or B2 level exam before travelling. Fluency in English is expected too.
- 4. Vocational skillset:** Mandatory to meet the work permit requirements is a 2 to 4 years vocational education at an accredited institution, well aligned with a specific vocational job-in-demand in Germany. Bachelor, Diploma or Certificates level. Proven work experience is a plus and mandatory when vocational college has been 2 years instead of 3 or 4 years.
- 5. Mindset:** The right mindset to master the new country & workplace culture. We call it the **#PlaySmartWorkHard** mindset, which is characterised by:
 - a)** Hands-on work (we don't offer office jobs)
 - b)** Pace, productivity, efficiency
 - c)** Punctuality, discipline
 - d)** First time right attitude (quality & process wise)
 - e)** Customer centricity
- 6. Documents:** To qualify for the process it needs several documents. A resume, a passport, police clearance certificate (good conduct), medical test, authenticated certificates of vocational college.

THE CANDIDATE PROCESS

HANDS-ON JOBS

Getting you a job contract and a work permit in Germany or other European countries is our daily business. The EU countries have strict work permit requirements in place. To meet them it's very important that your education and skills are well aligned with the jobs in demand as listed on our website. It's all about hands-on jobs, not about office jobs.

BENEFITS OF WORKING IN GERMANY

Before you decide to go abroad for work, it's recommended to have a closer look at all factors. Check out important aspects for your long term well-being or your future financial situation like the ones below.

- **Medical system:** The German system offers one of the best levels of health care on the globe. The healthcare system is accessible to everyone due to every citizen having a basic insurance, deducted from the gross salary. Half of this insurance is paid by the employee, half by the employer. The state hospitals and private hospitals are accessible to everyone with a public health care insurance.

- **Pension accrual:** Germany has one of the best public pension systems in the world. Everyone who has worked at least 45 years or reaches the age of 67, is pensioned and receives a „Rente“ (pension). This pension is paid monthly by the state pension fund until end of life. You can even choose to live e.g. in Africa after your pension has started and use the money there.

- **School fees:** For employees going abroad and having children it's good to know that Germany has a solid school system which ranks globally in the upper 25% range of the international PISA survey. Almost everyone, whether rich or poor, visits the same primary schools and secondary schools. The schools are free of charge. Class sizes are around 30 people. So you might save vast on school fees.

- **Vocational education system:** This typical German dual learn/work system for vocational education is worldwide unique. Dual means it has a company for which the employee - called „Auszubildender“ (apprentice) - works 2-3 days per week and the remaining days one goes to school for the theoretical skills needed for the profession. The duration is 3 or 4 years. It's important to understand this system when you are entering the German vocational labour market.

- **Family reunification:** You are entitled to family reunification in Germany with your spouse and biological children. We recommend to travel first alone, and start the reunification process after e.g. 6 months when you are settled.



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
